# **Celebrating 100 Years**

On January 27, 1911, the South Dakota Sigma chapter was founded by Charles W. Sterling. Now, 100 years later, South Dakota Sigma is still standing strong. This summer, please clear your calendar for the "can't miss event."

On June 24<sup>th</sup>-25<sup>th</sup>, our Alumni Association in coordination with SAE Nationals will be hosting an event where you can reconnect with brothers, meet new members of the house, and reflect on all the good times that the fraternity life has impacted on your life.

The celebration will "kick off" starting at 1 pm Friday, June 24<sup>th</sup>. There will be a golf tournament at the Elmwood Golf Course in Sioux Falls, SD. The tournament will feature an 18-hole course which includes pin prizes, cart rental, and some appetizers after the round. The cost is \$65 per person. Following the tournament, there will be a social hosted at the Ramkota Hotel. Even though there is no official schedule or timeline for the social, they are predicting to begin the social at 6pm.

Saturday, June 25<sup>th</sup>, will feature a bus trip to Vermillion to view the chapter house and USD's campus. This event is scheduled for 10am, but is optional for everyone. If you wish to attend this bus trip back to Vermillion, we are requesting that you register online to have an estimate of how many will need a ride to and from Sioux Falls. This cost is roughly about \$20 which will include a 12:30pm lunch at the Chapter house. The bus also plans on stopping by Carey's Bar for a drink or two and then returning to Sioux Falls approximately around 3pm.

Beginning at 6pm, please join us again for another social hour. Appetizers and drinks will be available at the Ramkota hotel bar. Finally, our brotherhood dinner will begin at 7pm and end about 9pm. The cost will be around \$50 that will feature filet mignon, chicken roulade, salad, vegetable, and desert. The current Eminent Supreme Archon, Dr. Martin D. Wiglesworth, and the current Eminent Supreme Recorder, Steven K. Priepke, will be in attendance and making a presentation.

# **A New Facelift**

During the summer of 2010, the South Dakota Sigma Chapter house began renovations upstairs, in the formal living room, and in the basement. The hallways that run upstairs were given a fresh coat of paint, brightening the hallways and covering up the scuffs and marks that were visually present by moving from semester to semester.

Our Chapter Room in the basement was repainted as well. Also, through alumni donations and tapping into the 1911 fund, our chapter was able to lay laminate flooring to give the room a more comfortable feel. Of course, with every project comes complications and this room was no different. After about two weeks with our new floor, the Vermillion community experienced heavy rainfall which ended up flooding our basement. Thanks to swift action by our House Corporation, the insurance covered the costs of replacing 70% of the floor and deodorizing the Pit and downstairs library. In addition to our new floor, our chapter was able to purchase new chairs for all of our members instead of having to haul chairs from the dining room before every meeting.

The final project that our house accomplished this year was the formal living room. Thanks to extra help that was contributed by parents and undergraduate brothers, we were able to cut costs significantly. We painted the walls a dark red color and put in a dark brown carpet. Then we accented the room with new leather couches and hung pictures of famous SAE brothers on the wall. As well as new carpet in the living room, we covered the stairs leading to the chapter room and Ma Raymond's Hallway with the new carpet.

Our chapter only has begun to bring new life to different parts of the house and will continue to do a little bit every summer. Talks of a new deck, renovations to the pit, downstairs library, and upstairs study room have already begun to circulate.

# 1911 Fund Update

In January of 2003, South Dakota Sigma established an additional component to the 1911 Fund known as the "Century Club." Once an alumnus has donated over \$100 to the fund from 2003 and on, he is known as a Century Club member. We honor these brothers by placing a plaque, including the name and year graduated, on the bricks in Ma Raymond's Hallway. The plaque fills the size of one brick and consists of gold lettering on a black background.

Once an alumnus has donated above \$500, the black plaque is removed from the wall and is replaced with a red plaque. The black plaque is sent in the mail immediately after removing it from Ma Raymond's Hallway. Once an alumnus meets the \$1,000 level, the red plaque is removed and is changed with a gold plaque. Finally after reaching the \$5,000 donation mark, the plaque will be replaced with a large 8x10 plaque which will be hung above the fireplace in the formal living room. All of the donations made from January 2003 to the present year have been recorded by the Alumni Relations Chairman.

The 1911 Fund is set up solely for house improvements. In the past, we have tapped into the fund to help accommodate the expenses that we incurred for our renovations to the formal living room, upstairs bathroom, dining room, and chapter room. All donations made to the 1911 Fund can be used as a tax write-off since South Dakota Sigma is a non-profit organization.

Many new members were currently added last semester and we are hoping to see many new names in the near future before the SD Sigma 100<sup>th</sup> Year Anniversary. Any donations are encouraged since all amounts are a accumulated and added to your own name instead of just a onetime donation.
